Come and join us on the day they are confirmed so you can remember your own confirmation day and those promises you made as you confessed the faith before God and many witnesses. As we spoke of before the faith is passed down from generation to generation by you being present at their confirmation it shows the faith is being passed on once again. Please come and join us.







Kirk will be transitioning into the Executive Director position as Doug Kading will be retiring. Doug has served as the Executive Director for 30 years.

A thorough hiring process was conducted by the Executive Committee of Camp Okoboji's Board of Directors. The process provided a pool of 10 qualified applicants who were objectively screened, with three candidates being formally interviewed. After further deliberation and prayer, the Executive Committee recommended Kirk Warnke to the Board of Directors as the next Executive Director. The Board of Directors unanimously approved the recommendation.

Kirk Warnke served as Vice President at Heartland Bank in Somers, Iowa since August 2003. Other experiences included opportunities to develop a history of management within the banking industry and in private enterprise as controller and CFO.

Kirk is a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Pomeroy, Iowa. At Immanuel, he has served as President of the congregation, Board of Directors member, Elder, Finance Committee, Education Committee, Trustee, Sunday School teacher, Usher, Camp Okoboji delegate, and Iowa District West Convention delegate. He has served on the Board of Directors at Camp Okoboji for 20 years and as its Treasurer for 15 years. He is presently serving as a member of the Board of Directors of the Iowa District West Endowment and Legacy Committee.

Making Adjustments

The day began with a few flakes of snow in the air and before long, our world turned white. It snowed heavier than we had seen in years; and it didn't let up until late afternoon when there was at least six inches of the cold white stuff covering our world. Cars were sliding on the streets and getting stuck and traffic accidents were happening around the state, some tragically.



A man in a delivery van drove down our long driveway as he has done many times before. This time, there was snow with crisscrossing tracks snaking through it. Instead of getting out of his

normal delivery routine, the driver did what he always does. He turned the corner from our circle drive back onto the lane towards the street. The back wheels began to spin. Instead of moving forward, the vehicle slid sideways and came to rest against a large tree. He didn't adjust for the new driving conditions. If he had made more of a square corner on his turn, the problem could have been avoided. He had to call a tow truck to get back on the road.

What about our life? Do we make adjustments when things change? Do we go day-to-day doing the same things we have done for years? For example, when you learn about mission opportunities, do you read them and put them aside? Do you think someone else will probably go? Do you think you could be the one to go? You could do what Brynlee Grieme from St. Paul Lutheran Church in Schaller, Iowa did. Sharri Hansen shares what Brynlee did to serve others. "Every Sunday I talk to my 1st and 2nd graders in Sunday School about helping others. I tell them that there are children and adults who are homeless or just don't have as much as what God has blessed us with. One little girl who is the sweetest little girl really listens and she asks questions about it. I mentioned saving soaps if they go to a hotel. Soon Brynlee brought a little set of soaps from a hotel.

"I thanked her and gave her a bag that she could keep at home and bring back later. She asked if she could have two bags. I gave her two and in a few weeks she brought both bags full of items

for children. She received a new toy for Christmas that was a duplicate. Her mom thought Brynlee would exchange it for new toy. Nope. She told her mom she had plenty toys and that she wanted it for homeless kids. This little girl knows what it means to follow Jesus. The best part is that she asked for two more bags to fill."

Sharri also shared that St. Paul's Sunday school is sponsoring two children in Haiti and learning more about ETCH from Larry and Cheryl Olofson. To learn more about the ETCH outreach, please contact Larry and Cheryl Olofson at 515-298-0884.

So there you have it, a number of mission opportunities! You are the driver down the road of life. What will you do? If you don't change your routine and "drive the road" a little differently, you won't be part of any of these God adventures. You hear about opportunities at your church to serve as Brynlee did. I encourage you to pray about and look for ways to serve.

Will you drive a different road once you see the landscape has changed? Will you drive a different road when you are aware of service opportunities? Or, will you take the same road, and do the same routine you have always done? The adventure is up to you. I challenge you to make an adjustment. Consider a mission adventure. Drive that new road. Avoid sliding into trees!
