





Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

Many Lutheran congregations hold a Reformation Sunday in October, ordinarily on the last Sunday. This service provides an opportunity for our congregations to reflect on our heritage, reaffirm our commitment to the core principles of the Reformation: *Sola Scriptura*, *Sola Fide* and *Sola Gratia*. The Latin word *sola* means "only" or "alone."

Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)

We believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God. It alone is the supreme authority in all matters of faith, life and practice. It emphasizes that Scripture alone is sufficient for guiding the life, beliefs and practices of Christians.

Sola Fide (Faith Alone)

We believe that salvation is received only through faith and not by works. The gift of forgiveness is received through faith in what Christ has done for us. The life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is the only means by which individuals can be justified and made right with God.

Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)

We believe salvation is an unearned gift from God, granted by His grace. I have often said grace is my favorite word. Please read the following slowly:

The grace of God is His unmerited favor, kindness and mercy to you.

No matter how you see yourself, grace is how God sees you! God's love is freely given, and not something that can be obtained from human effort or earned, nor is it deserved.

The concept of *sola* ("alone") is a bit of a paradox because the solas are never alone. We can add to this short list:

Sola Christus (Christ Alone)

We believe that salvation is achieved solely through the atoning work of Jesus Christ, and that the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross at Calvary was completely sufficient to cover all sin. John the Baptist proclaimed:

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29

Christ alone is the mediator between God and mankind. Jesus is the only means by which we are justified and reconciled to God.

Sola Deo Gloria (Glory to God Alone)

We believe that all glory is due to God alone. There is no room for human pride or accomplishment when considering our salvation. It is all from God, and to Him be the glory. We so often want to replace God with our own human accomplishments. *Sola Deo Gloria* reminds us that God is God!

These core principles of the Reformation are just as relevant to the church today as they were over 500 years ago. "We believe" means these promises belong to us today! I believe it is not only appropriate, but also important for our congregations to celebrate the Reformation; not to celebrate Luther or even our Lutheran heritage, but to celebrate and remember: We believe that God is for us.

who thrives on organization had to be ok with the plans changing multiple times (btw – flexibility is key when working in disaster situations). Through these situations, God connected







