The Sunday School staff would like to wish all our students and there families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year as be celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.





Relief for Human Need Worldwide

Dear Pastor and Congregation,

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) needs your help! Our Clemons, Iowa location, is one of 27 centers for the Orphan Grain Train operation headquartered in Norfolk, Nebraska. OGT is a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of our Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and has the highest (4-Star) rating that Charity Navigator gives out as it evaluates giving organizations.

The primary function of the OGT in Clemons is to collect clothes of all kinds (in good condition), shoes, quilts, medical supplies (i.e. walkers and crutches), bikes and trikes, school supplies and more! All these items are sorted and what can be packed goes into standard size boxes. Up to 1,460 boxes are loaded into cargo containers, sealed, and shipped to any of 71 countries. OGT contacts then receive and distribute the supplies to needy people, orphanages and schools.

In addition, other items like tanker trucks of clean water, scrub buckets, chainsaws and hygiene kits are also collected in Norfolk and sent to disaster areas where clean-up is going on (i.e. hurricanes Helene and Milton).

Right now, the Clemons Center has several major needs and that is why this letter is being shared. One need is for more volunteers to help sort and pack donated items. Our crew has been shrinking in size due to aging and the Lord calling folks home. More helpers would fill up the ranks. Our main workday is Tuesdays from 8 a.m. to noon. Any amount of time a person/group could volunteer would be greatly appreciated. As Jesus might say looking at our situation, "The workers are few, but the harvest is great."

A second specialized need is for someone who can repair bicycles. This can happen on site, or they can be taken home. Bicycles are in high demand, and we have many that need fixed before we can ship them.

Lastly, monetary donations and requested items are always appreciated; the needs are so great. Two brochures have been included. One explains what Orphan Grain Train is about as an organization, and the other covers our Central Iowa Branch, including what we collect and the kits we assemble. This is a great resource to get ideas of needed items.

If you would consider spreading the word about this opportunity to share the love of Christ, it would be greatly appreciated. Perhaps you can put an announcement in your bulletin or a blurb in your newsletter or however your church people receive their news. You can also call 515-708-6234 if you have questions or you can check us out on Facebook.

Our relief supplies are then matched up with mission partners from 69 countries around the world where they are distributed to orphanages, schools, churches, and hospitals

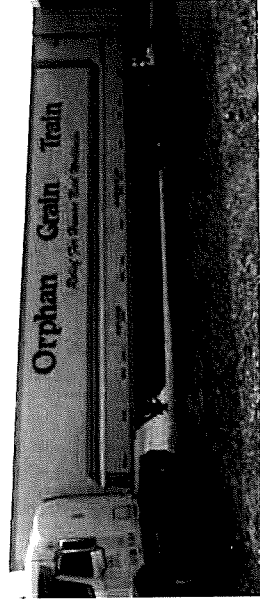

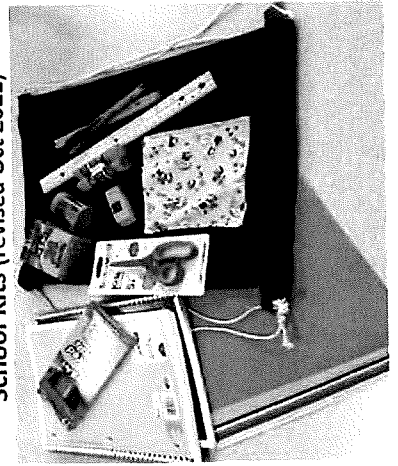
- * 1 bath towel
- * 1 bath-size bar of soap
- * 1 plastic soap box
- * 1 small size tissue pack
- * 1 tooth brush
- * 1 wash cloth
- * 1 comb
- * 6 band-aids
- * 1 nail clipper

Dark colored towels preferred

(Please no additions, deletions or substitutions, no plastic bags. Do not add money, photos, or personal notes.)

Spread the bath towel flat, lay the wash cloth 4 – 5 inches from the top. Place soap, tissue pack, etc. on the wash cloth, fold the sides into the center so it will be about 15 inches wide. Roll the bath towel and secure with string, yarn, or ribbon.

In loving response to Christ, the Servant, the Orphan Grain Train movement encourages and enables God's people to share personal and material resources in bringing Christ's name and character to needy people both far and near.

Sometimes that character expresses itself as a word well spoken, sometimes as a bandage well applied, and sometimes as a child well fed.

How Does It Work?

Orphan Grain Train has volunteers in 27 regional locations across the United States who gather clothing and other relief supplies for destitute people around the world. They also raise the money to send these relief goods and food where most needed.

Relief supplies are shipped from U.S. warehouses to 71 countries around the world. Then our mission partners distribute them to orphanages, schools, churches, and hospitals. Annually, OGT delivers more than \$40 million worth of humanitarian aid and food domestically and internationally.

Americans in several states have received relief supplies from Orphan Grain Train in the wake of natural disasters and for families in need.



Adopt an Orphanage continues to minister and bring aid to numerous orphanages in Russia, Latvia, Lithuania and Ukraine. The Hanna House provides a safe haven for those graduated from the orphanages to gather, learn a trade, and grow in Bible study and worship.
